

No responses from Worthing to date

Royal Sussex -


#### 29 responses in June/July/August 2023

- Unanimously families felt welcome
  - Everyone made us feel like we were fully supported and at home. We were encouraged and supported to help with our baby's development and have had the most amazing nurses that care for her.'
- Appreciation of 24hr access not treated as visitors
- All felt fully involved or as involved as they could be in baby's care
- Excellent feeding support
- Some missed medication and meals while on postnatal
- Mixed responses re food provision and parking high financial impact for some:
  - We probably spent about £30 a day on taxis, £20 on food, and had to get my daughter to attend nursery for additional days so we could be with our baby at the hospital which is £60 a day.'

Princess Royal -

7 responses in June/July/August 2023

- Great comments re a warm welcome
- Some missed medication due to being on neonatal ward
  - This put me in a lot of pain. The best day
    of care was when a midwife administered
    my observations in neo natal care..'
- Mixed responses to feeding support worth noting that some of this was from somebody who received care in 2021
- Some participated in ward rounds, others found this difficult to be part of
  - The Ward rounds happened mainly in the morning around 9am and it was a struggle to get to the rounds on time due to waiting on the medication and breakfast on the postnatal ward.'
- One parent noted that they would have liked more mental health support

- Continue to work on supporting MNVPs with 15 Steps/Walk the Patch where possible

#### **Achievements**


- Perineal clinic (pilot) at SRH every Tuesday (MDT)
- Love your hospital funding for Endoanal Ultrasound
- Self referral up and running on Sussex LMNS website
- Pelvic Health screening on Badgernet at 16/40 and immediate referral system





#### **Achievements**

- Midwifery training successful and plan to continue
- Patient information leaflets being finalised. Inclusive images.
- Ongoing collaboration and shared resources with WEPP





#### **Challenges**

- Staff shortages unable to provide ward cover at RSCH and PRH at present.
- SRH ward cover also down 50%.
- Renewed recruitment effort and ensuring everyone receives necessary information.

- Continued collaboration with specialist services – WIP, Diabetes in Pregnancy, PMH, Smoking cessation
- Social Media launch


